

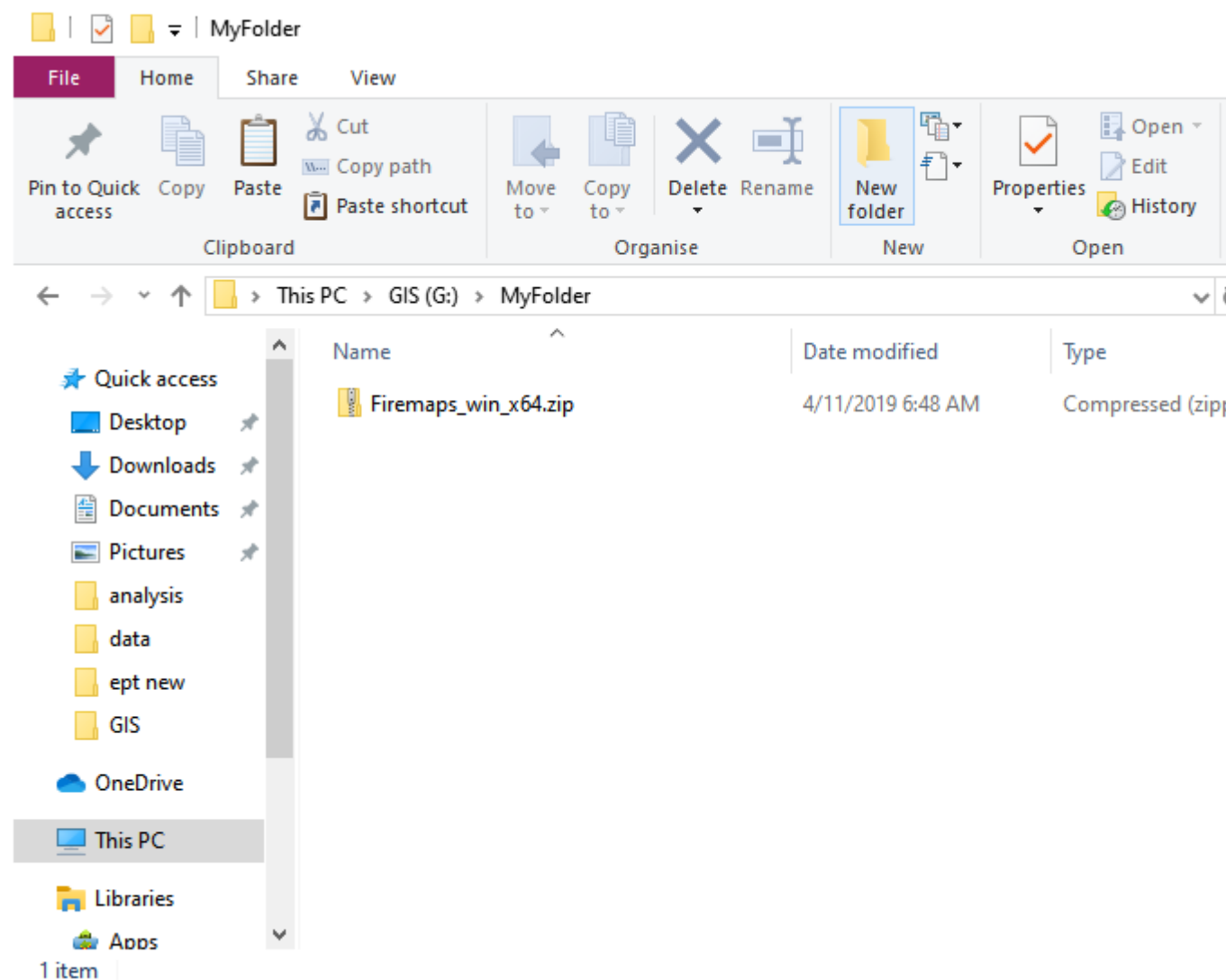


FireMaps Installation Guide

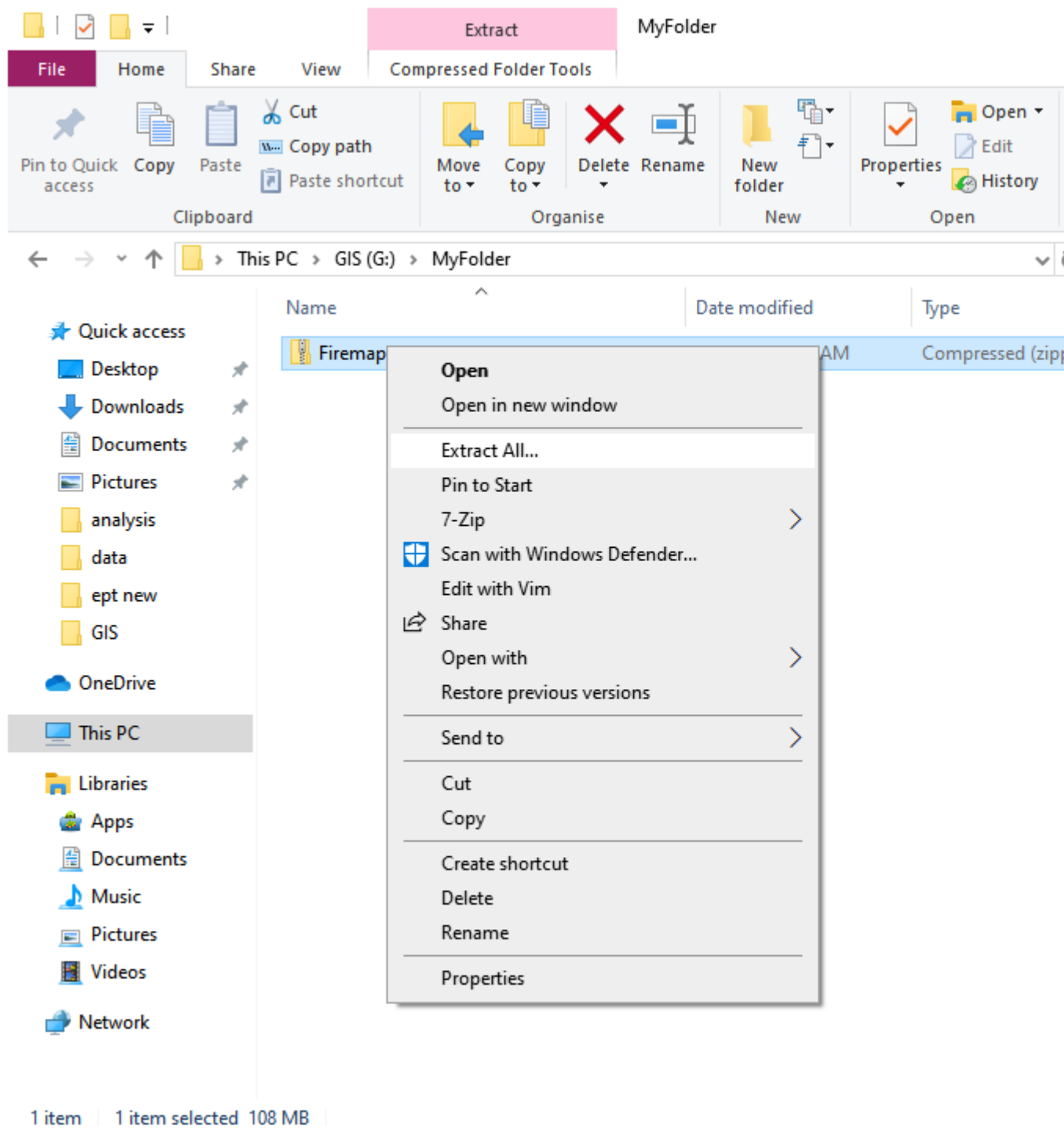
FireMaps is available for Windows and MacOS running 64-bit operating systems. FireMaps is downloadable as ZIP files and does not require running an installer as the program and associated files are all self-contained within the folder.

Installation for Windows

Download FireMaps zip file: https://maps.fpaafiremaps.com.au/Firemaps_win_x64.zip using your web browser. Save the zip file to a folder on your computer or your downloads folder. The desktop will suffice if you are happy storing it there. In the example below, the zip file is stored in a folder called “MyFolder” on the G: drive:




Extract the zip file here. To do so, right-click on the zip file and select “Extract All...”.



You will be asked where to extract the files too. Select the current folder – or elsewhere as you decide to put it.

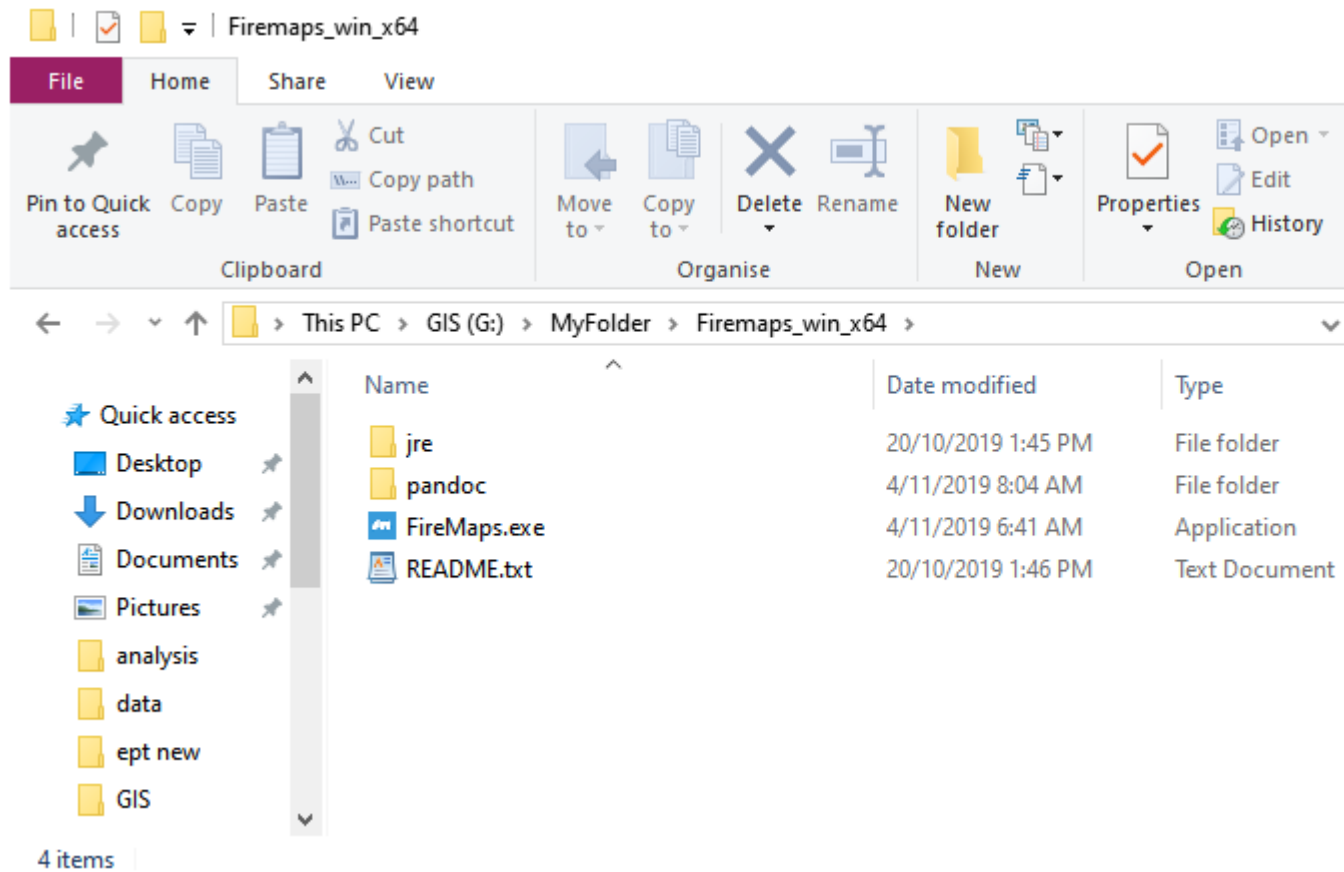

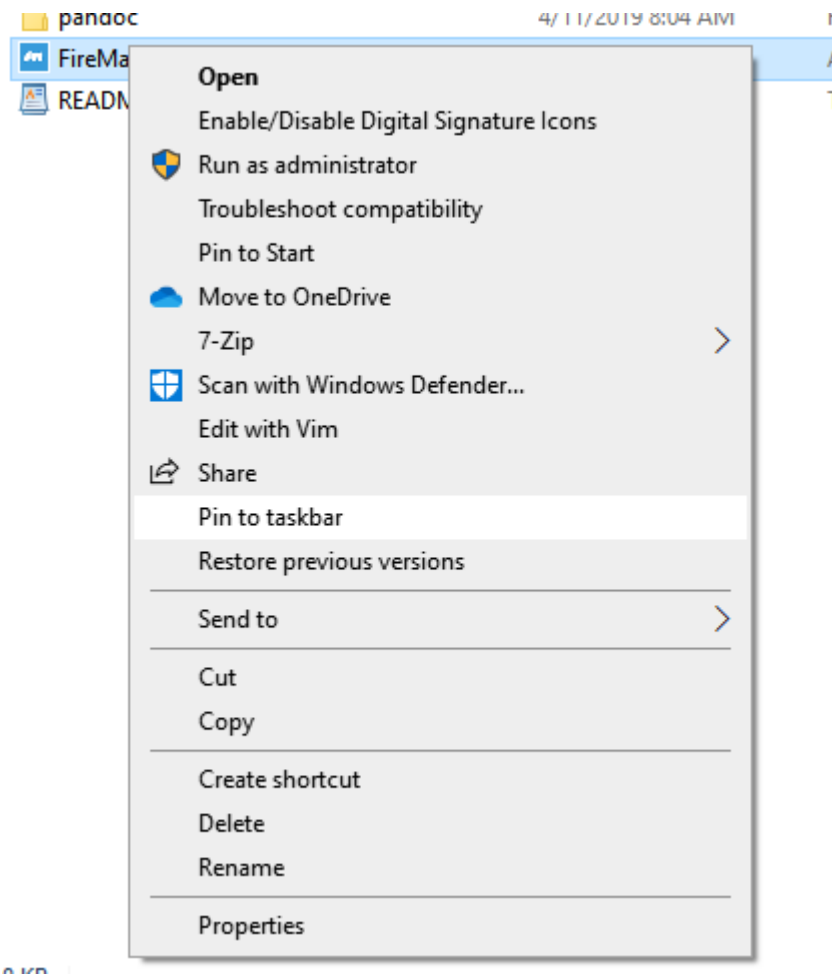

When the extract is complete open the Firemaps_win_x64 folder:

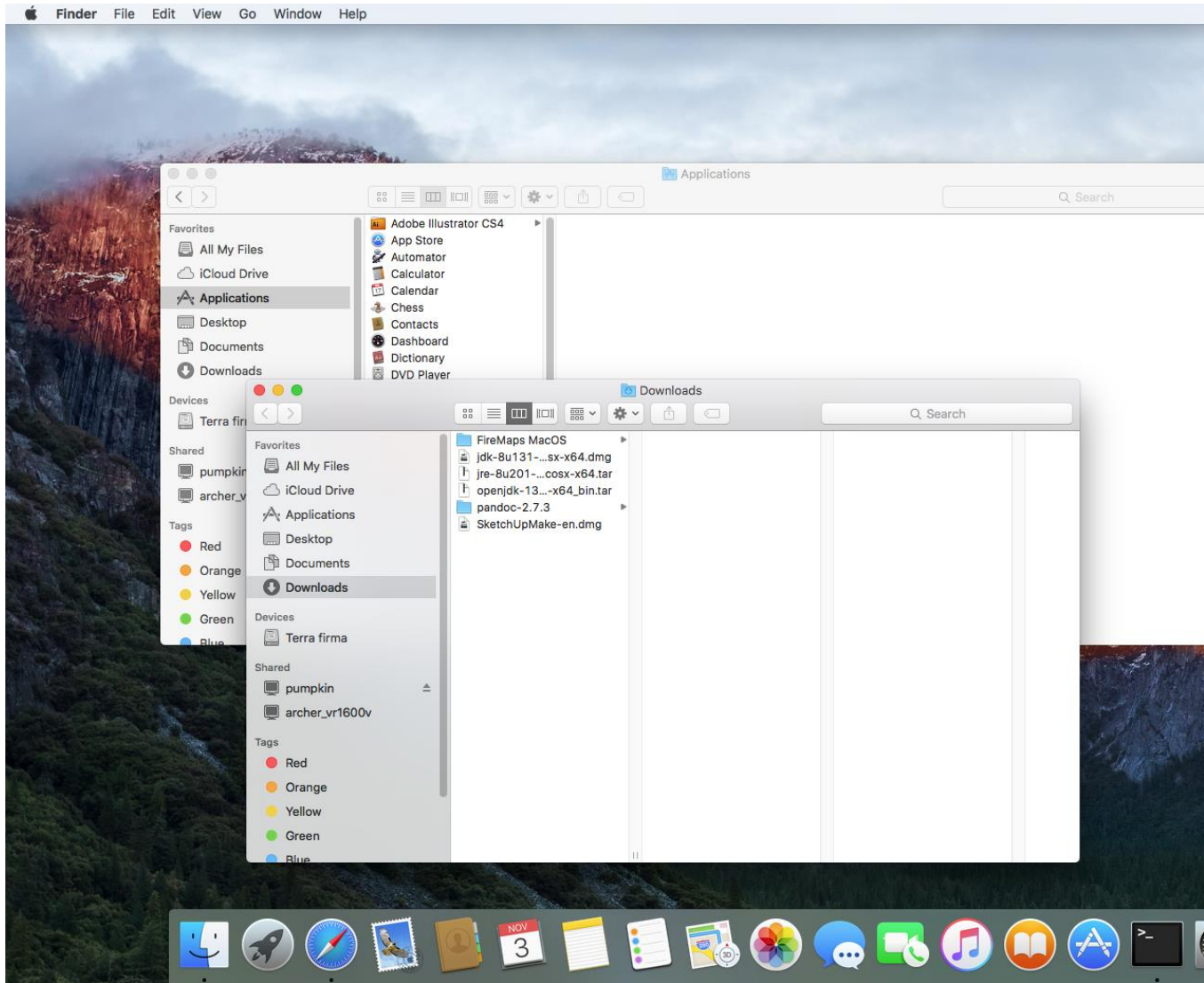


Double-click on FireMaps.exe to start FireMaps. You may be prompted – for the first time - to allow for permission to open FireMaps.exe. For your convenience, you can right-click on FireMaps.exe and pin to your start or task bar.

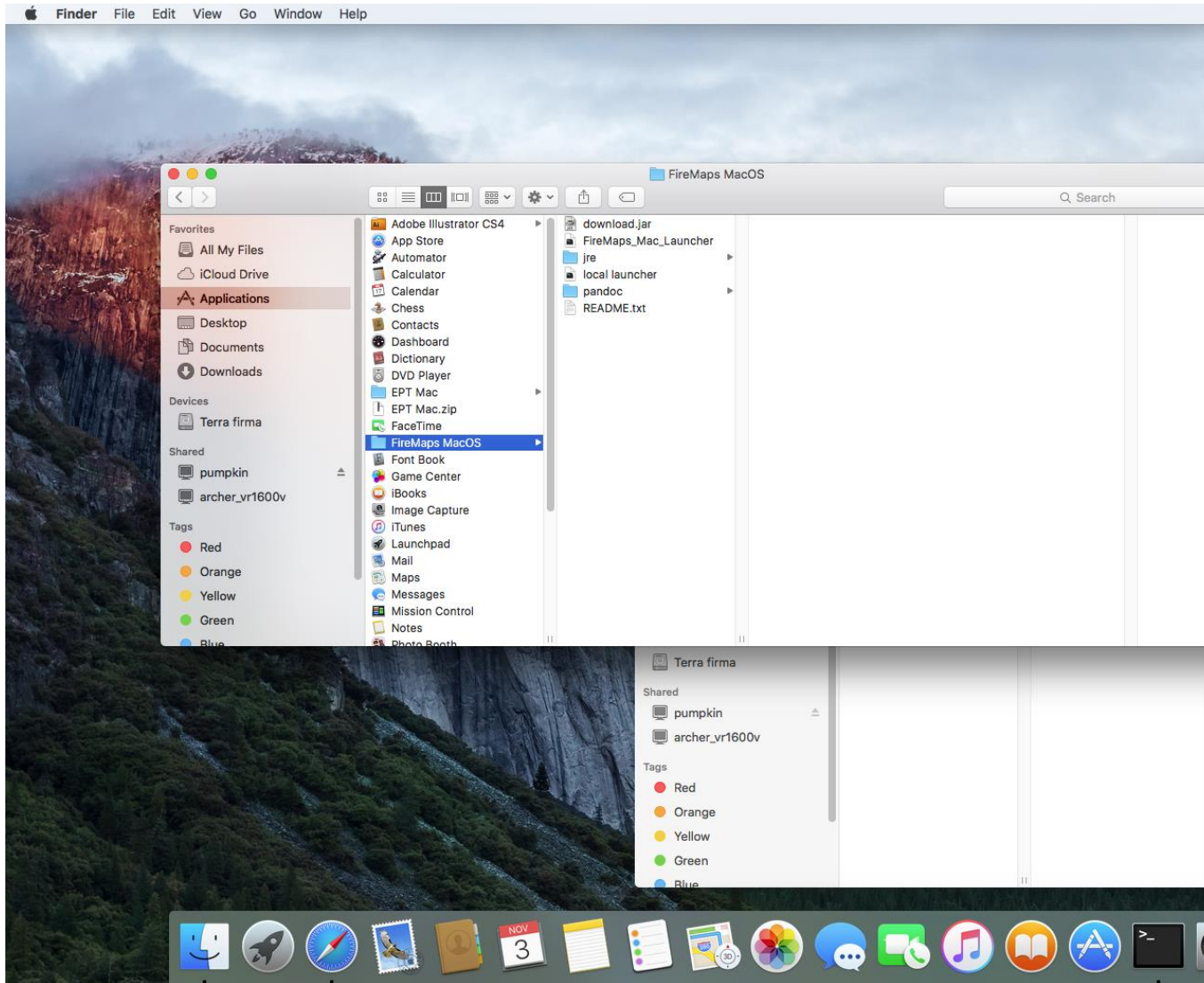


Installation for MacOS

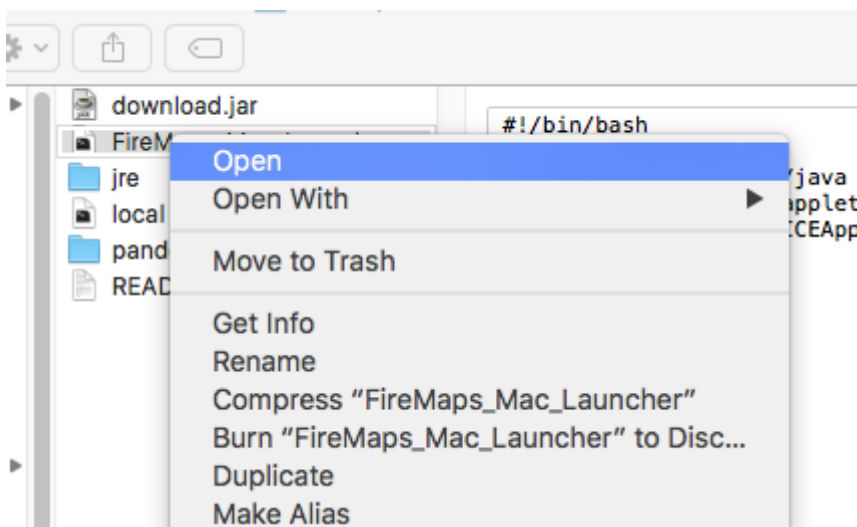
Download FireMaps zip file: https://maps.fpaafiremaps.com.au/Firemaps_MacOS.zip using your web browser. Open the downloads folder:



Drag and drop the FireMaps MacOS folder into your Applications folder:



Hold down CONTROL key and click on “FireMaps_Mac_Launcher”:



Click on the Open menu option. You will be prompted with a security alert to trust this application. Click on “Open”:



FireMaps will then start. You only have to do this process once. In future you can just double-click on the "FireMaps Mac Launcher" file to start FireMaps.
